Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Coronavirus (Covid-19) continues to spread, and the implications of it have proven to be tragic in some cases (1, 541, 538 cases worldwide and 90, 086 deaths worldwide according to CDC/WHO). It is recommended that the following procedures are put into practice to help monitor and prevent spread of the Coronavirus -COVID-19.

Practice preventative measures outlined by the CDC, which include:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially if you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Put distance between yourself and other people if COVID-19 is spreading in your community. This is especially important for people who are at a higher risk of getting very sick.

Above all, trust God who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all we ask or think.
